

Q1 Are you a resident of the Town of Salisbury? This includes the villages of Lakeville, Taconic, Lime Rock, Amesville, and Salisbury.





Q2 Please select the option that best represents your current housing situation:













Q7 Have you experienced challenges to finding the type of housing you would like in Salisbury?







Q9 Do you anticipate that at some point, you or your parents or children might have to move out of Salisbury to find the housing you/they need?





Q10 Have your family members or friends experienced challenges to finding suitable housing in Salisbury?





Q11 If YES, what challenges have your family members or friends experienced? (Check all that apply)





Q12 What housing options do you think the Town of Salisbury needs more of? (Check all that apply)





Q13 Do you think the cost or availability of housing in Salisbury affects the town's ability to attract and retain younger people or young families?





Q14 Do you think the cost of housing in Salisbury affects the town's ability to keep seniors (65 yrs and older) in town?





Q15 Do you think the cost of housing in Salisbury affects the town's ability to recruit Lakeville Hose Company or Salisbury Ambulance volunteers?







Q17 Have you ever attended any Town Meeting or informational session in Salisbury that addressed affordable housing?







Q19 Do you support construction of more housing options in Salisbury using State, Federal, and Local funding sources?






